
Homeowner Possible Leak Checklist

- 1. Shut off each toilet for several hours (preferably overnight), turn back on and listen...if you hear water filling the tank you have a toilet leak.
- 2. If you have a humidifier attached to your furnace..it uses a lot of water when the furnace is running. You may need to adjust the settings.
- 3. Make sure if hoses are attached to an outside spigot, you don't have water escaping at the connection and/or the connected hoses or sprayer head.
- 4. Inspect the ground where your service line leaves the meter and enters the house. If you have a service line that goes to an out building, inspect it as well.
- 5. If a service line runs under a cement patio or porch, turn your water off for the entire house and listen closely to where the pipe enters the house. If you hear a hissing noise you have a leak under the patio/porch.
- 6. Inspect all livestock waterers...sometimes they get stuck open or when thawing from cold weather they break.
- 7. A continuous drip from a faucet or shower head can add up.
- 8. If you have no water running (shower, dishwasher, wash machine, flushing a toilet).
 - a. Find the outside meter.
 - b. Pop the lid (DO NOT attempt this if outside temps are below 32*F)
 - c. Look at the face of the meter.

- i. There is a triangle on the bottom left.
- ii. Watch this triangle for several seconds. If it is moving you have a leak somewhere. To help determine if the leak is inside the house or outside the house...turn the main water off in the house. Check the triangle again if moving it's outside the house.
